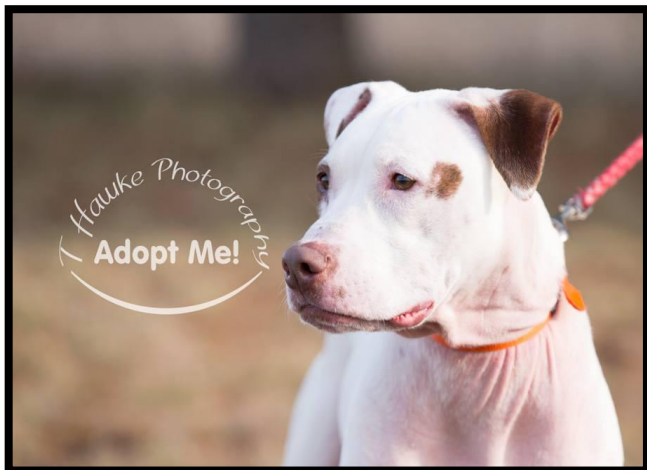


BE A FOSTER SAVE A LIFE

South Wood County Humane Society's Foster Care Program provides temporary housing and care for dogs, cats, puppies and kittens who aren't quite ready for adoption. In 2015, our network of foster volunteers helped to save the lives of 70 animals! We need loving homes like yours to continue helping these animals in need of a little extra time and care.



Foster Volunteer FAQs

What kind of animals need foster care?

- Puppies and kittens under two months old
- Mothers with nursing litters
- Dogs or cats with medical conditions or injuries
- Special needs fosters

Can I become a foster parent if I have pets?

Yes, we welcome pet owners as foster volunteers. Please keep in mind that there is always a health risk when exposing your pets to other animals, in any setting. However, the risk is minimal if your pets are vaccinated and in good health.

How long do animals stay in foster care?

The typical foster stay is two weeks to two months, depending on the needs of the individual animal(s) in your care. The timeframe of each foster situation will be discussed with you ahead of time.

What expenses are involved with foster care?

Foster families provide housing, food, bedding and toys for the animals in their care. They also provide exercise, socialization and lots of love! The Humane Society provides all medical care for animals in foster homes, including vaccination, medications and spay/neuter surgery.
